**Energy Market Investigation** 

The CMA has identified a number of adverse impacts to competition and has issued the following regulations to address these market inefficiencies.

## The Energy Market Investigation (Microbusinesses<sup>1</sup>) Order 2016:

As of 26 June 2017

- All energy suppliers must make prices available to businesses which consume under 73,200kWh of gas and 50,000kWh of electricity (with any meter point in profile class 1-4). Suppliers will host these either on their own website, or on a Third Party Intermediary (TPI) 'price comparison' website.
- Microbusinesses on a contract that automatically rolls over can end the contract at any point after it has rolled over without incurring a termination fee. Also, once it has rolled over, the contract must not exceed 12 months.

## The Energy Market Investigation (Database) Order 2016:

- Energy suppliers must identify microbusiness customers who have been on default contracts for more than three years and provide the customer data to Ofgem on a monthly basis.
- Ofgem will make a database of 'disengaged customers<sup>2\*\*'</sup> available to energy suppliers on 30 April 2018. Customers on the database can be approached by suppliers and offered a more competitive price.
- Protecting the privacy and security of customer data remains a priority. Ørsted will let customers know what information will be included on the database and how they can opt out.
